

Sainsbury's SCHOOL GAMES

MARK 2014/15 CRITERIA

The Sainsbury's School Games Mark is now in its 4th year and continues to reward schools for their commitment to and development of competition, school sport and physical education. The following criteria will help schools assess themselves across BRONZE, SILVER and GOLD levels of the award.

In order to achieve any level of the Sainsbury's School Games Mark, schools must meet the following prerequisites.

During the 2014/15 academic year, schools must have:

Participation

- ✓ a system in place to track young people's participation in the Sainsbury's School Games;
- ✓ opportunities that attract less active young people to participate in physical activity;

Competition

- ✓ held a Sainsbury's School Games Day as the culmination of a year-round competition programme;
- ✓ a calendar of competition that demonstrates opportunities for young people with SEND to take part in competitions;
- ✓ a notice board promoting Sainsbury's School Games activity.

Sainsbury's School Games Mark 2014/15 criteria

BRONZE LEVEL



To achieve BRONZE LEVEL, your school must meet all of the prerequisites as well as the following:

Participation

- ✓ plans in place to provide all pupils with two hours of physical education and school sport per week inclusive of extra curriculum provision;
- ✓ **engage** at least 20% of students (5% for special schools) in extracurricular sporting activity every week;

Competition

- ✓ use the Sainsbury's School Games formats to provide the opportunity for both boys and girls to take part in the appropriate level of competition. **NB boys only or girls only for single-sex schools;**

- ✓ engage at least 5% of students in leading, managing and officiating Sainsbury's School Games activity.

SILVER LEVEL

To achieve **SILVER LEVEL**, your school must meet all of the prerequisites as well as the following:

Participation

- ✓ provide **all** students with two hours of physical education and school sport per week (made up of curricular and extracurricular activity);
- ✓ **engage** at least 35% of students (10% for special schools) in extracurricular sporting activity every week;

Competition

- ✓ use the Sainsbury's School Games formats to provide the opportunity for both boys and girls to take part in the appropriate level of competition. **NB boys only or girls only for single-sex schools;**

- ✓ use the Sainsbury's School Games formats to provide the opportunity through inter-school competition (Level 2) for both boys and girls to take part in 'B' -team standard competition. **NB boys only or girls only for single-sex schools;**

- ✓ promote the Sainsbury's School Games to parents and the local community at least once every half term;
- ✓ regularly feature match reports and competition results on the school website and in the local press;

Workforce

- ✓ engage at least 10% of students in leading, managing and officiating Sainsbury's School Games activity;
- ✓ engage students in the planning and development of Sainsbury's School Games activity;
- ✓ utilise sports coaches to support school sport;

Clubs

- ✓ have active links with at least three local sports clubs (**one for special schools**).

Sainsbury's School Games Mark 2014/15 criteria



GOLD LEVEL

To achieve **GOLD LEVEL**, your school must meet all of the prerequisites as well as the following:

Participation

- ✓ provide **all** students with two hours of physical education per week (within the curriculum only); and have extra curriculum provision in addition to this;
- ✓ **engage** at least 50% of students (20% for special schools) in extracurricular sporting activity every week;

The provision of support for talented young sports people

1. **secondary criteria:** offer talented young sports people specific support to help them to balance their sporting commitments with school and home life;
2. **primary and special criteria:** offer talented young sports people specific support to help them to develop their sporting potential;

Competition

- ✓ use the Sainsbury's School Games formats to provide the opportunity for both boys and girls to take part in the appropriate level of competition. **NB boys only or girls only for single-sex schools;**

- ✓ use the Sainsbury's School Games formats to provide the opportunity through inter-school competition (Level 2) for both boys and girls to take part in 'B' and 'C' -team standard competition. **NB boys only or girls only for single-sex schools;**

- ✓ promote the Sainsbury's School Games to parents and the local community **once a fortnight;**
- ✓ regularly feature match reports and competition results on the school website and in the local press;

Workforce

- ✓ engage at least 20% of students in leading, managing and officiating Sainsbury's School Games activity;
- ✓ have a School Sport Organising Committee or Crew in place;
- ✓ utilise sports coaches to support school sport;
- ✓ train wider school staff to support school sport;

Clubs

- ✓ have active links with at least six local sports clubs (**two for special schools**).
